SUMMER RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM COVID-19 GUIDELINES

Updated 4/14/22

The following are University COVID-19 guidelines required for all Third-Party Organizations hosting a summer residential program on the Homewood Campus.

• There are currently no capacity limits on indoor events or in-person dining, beyond Fire Code capacity, but participants in such events and dining should be appropriately, socially distanced when possible.

Vaccination

- Guests must be compliant with the current (April 2022) JHU vaccination policy as of the first day of their summer program:
 - COVID-19 vaccination and either the Pfizer or Moderna COVID booster shot is required. Johnson and Johnson is NOT an accepted booster shot with the University.
 - International guests who have received a vaccine authorized by the World Health Organization but not one authorized by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, must have one booster dose (either Pfizer or Moderna).
- Children under the age of 5 who are not eligible to be vaccinated are not permitted into University facilities which includes on move-in days to the residential facilities. Any parents or family members on move-in day must follow the vaccination and masking policy.

Testing

- All guests must have a negative COVID test before starting the program. The test should be conducted before arriving on campus and students who are COVID positive should notify their program and not travel. Either a rapid antigen test (not more than 24 hours beforehand) or a PCR test (not more than 72 hours beforehand) is acceptable.
- Asymptomatic guests who are <u>unvaccinated</u> must test twice per week throughout their program.
- Generally, asymptomatic vaccinated guests will be exempt from regular surveillance testing.

Isolation

- Covid-positive residential program participants are expected to leave campus within **24 hours**.
- Those who are fully vaccinated who have had a close contact with someone who tested positive do not need to quarantine. Close contact is defined as 15 or more continuous minutes of contact within 6-foot distance and unmasked.

Masking

- Guests will follow the university masking guidelines that are in place at the time of the session.
- If you choose to wear a mask, the most effective types of face coverings are:
 - o N95 masks
 - o KN95 masks
 - o KF94 masks
 - A combination of a cloth mask with a surgical mask
- If you have an approved vaccination exception, masks are still required and one of the above options must be used.

All guests and visitors on the Homewood campus are expected to follow all University COVID-19 guidelines as they apply.
