Dear Calvin,

We have received the report and decision from the University related to the recent investigation and hearings held related to behavioral complaints against our chapter. It is our intention to comply with the terms of the University's decision thru the date specified so far as it is practical. We reserve the right to pursue other JHU and non-JHU administrative or legal mechanisms to modify this decision. We politely disagree with the terms and conditions of the decision, especially as related to our ability to perform philanthropic and community service projects. These specific restrictions serve no useful or constructive purpose, and are excessive relative to the offenses alleged.

The chapter voted last fall to give its Executive Committee the authority to withdraw from University recognition if the Committee believed such action to be warranted. We have refrained from such a serious move in the hope that our relationship with the administration of the University could be improved and that the University was genuinely interested in a healthy fraternity and sorority system and was open to a reasonable and common-sense approach to regulation of the Greek system. It appears that our hopes for such an outcome were unfounded.

The Johns Hopkins Chapter of Alpha Delta Phi hereby resigns from the Interfraternity Council and withdraws immediately from recognition by the University. At the joint request of the chapter and of our alumni association, our national organization has declared the charter of this chapter to be inactive, as well as the status of the current undergraduate members to be inactive.
