

Graduate Representative Organization GC Meeting Summary (February 3rd, 2025)

- I. Call to Order and Agenda Review
- II. Approval of December 2nd Meeting Minutes passed (Motion ID 156):
 - **GC** Minutes 02.03.25
- III. New E-board and GC Members
 - A. Introduced:
 - 1. E-board: Omotayo Adenuga (Professional Development Chair), Peter Olatunji (Admin and Funding Chair).
 - 2. GC Reps: Jiantong Liao (Modern Languages and Literature), Rishabh Humbare, Warnika Sinha (Engineering Management).
- IV. Advocathon Updates
 - A. Arman provided an overview of the Advocathon, highlighting:
 - 1. Engagement processes, topics covered, and outcomes.
 - 2. Key areas of focus included
 - a) Graduate course evaluation
 - b) Graduate representation
 - c) Changes to protest policies
 - d) Mentorship programs
 - e) Surveillance cameras on campus.
 - B. He called for volunteers interested in advocating for additional areas, such as recreation, communications, food access, and information availability.
 - C. KSAS Course Evaluation Proposal
 - 1. Chris presented three options for course evaluations:
 - a) Open Evaluations: Available but not mandatory for grade access.
 - b) Opt-out Evaluations: Students must open the evaluation form before opting out to receive grades early.
 - c) Incentivized Evaluations: Students receive early grade access for completing the quantitative portion of evaluations, while free responses remain optional.
 - 2. Concerns were raised about the applicability of these options, particularly regarding how they might impact student participation and privacy.
 - 3. After considerable discussion, the GC voted to propose Option 1 to the administration (Motion ID 157).
 - D. Protest Policy Statement

- 1. The administration clarified that the current protest policy had been reworded, not fundamentally changed.
- 2. Gabby is working on a statement regarding this matter, which is still in development.

E. Graduate Representation

- 1. Gabby advocated for involving the GRO in the selection of representatives for various advisory committees, rather than allowing the administration to choose based on convenience.
- 2. Specific examples included committees like the police hiring committee and the Doctor of Philosophy Board.
- 3. The group discussed the importance of cross-departmental representation and ensuring that the GRO is recognized in committee selections.
- 4. A motion was passed to send out the representation statement for feedback from the entire GC (Motion ID 158).

F. Committee on Student Matter Statement

- 1. Gabby solicited support for including graduate representation in the Committee on Student Matters (CAM) during discussions with KSAS deans.
- 2. A motion passed to include this request as an active participant in the upcoming meeting with Vice Dean Chen (Motion ID 159).

V. Advocacy Updates -Shubham presented

- A. Upcoming meetings with key administrators were announced:

 - 2. Vice-Dean Chen (KSAS): February 19th, 12-1 PM.
