- I. Call to Order and Agenda Review
 - The meeting was called to order at 6:10 pm
- II. Approval of March 03, 2025, Meeting Minutes: GC Minutes 03.03.25
 - Motion to approve minutes (ID 168)
 - Motion passes
- III. Sabine and Rachelle Update
 - Email to all students to put through the questions they may have regarding the new federal funding situation.
 - Encouraged GRO to help recirculate so that no student is left behind
 - Emphasis on guaranteed funding for the PhD students irrespective of the funding situation or PI budget cut.
 - 1. Caroline calls for questions from the GC that affect their department or other students.
 - 2. Will asked how much liquidity the University has to maintain the commitment to fund PhD students.
 - 3. Sabine mentioned there is no specific information on how much liquidity, but the University is in decent shape to support its staff and students and is hoping things get better before the worse happens.

- 4. Rachelle mentioned the university is prioritizing departments that might need support to meet the funding for Ph.D.s.
- 5. Ayo asked about the decrease in some department admissions for graduate offers, as reported by some members of the GC.
- 6. Sabine explained that it is not the case because the department is supported if needed to meet the student obligation. Also, the department already made offer decisions before the federal funding cut, and the decision is now on whether the student wants to come. Especially the PhD's
- 7. A GC member asked on who the student should contact in case their PI says they don't have enough funding.
 - a) Sabine responded that they should contact the department Dean and chair because the PI may not have the best information on funding issues.
 - b) Carolien: Who exactly should they contact if they are in the situation?
 - Sabinee said the program director or the Deans. Suggested Ronaide for KSAS and Christine for WSE
- 8. Another GC asked if the department and PI say no funding and if the PhD student still gets funded.
 - Sabine reiterated that the school works with different departments differently, and they will ensure the student gets the funding required.
- Arman mentioned having a coffee hour or another section to bring students together to discuss more on the federal funding cut issues and the implications going forward.
 - a) Sabine mentioned being at the KSASA town hall on Friday.
- 10. Liam from GC asked about the implications of ICE action on the community and campuses for Hopkins students.

- a) Sabine responded that there are resources and numbers to contact when any student is in such a situation. OIS was given as a good and best resources
- b) Rachelle emphasized the specific information and contacts on OIS to help students when they are in contact with ICE or have any immigration-related issues.
- 11. Marian, a GC member, asked about the resources available for international students traveling who get into situations at the airport.
 - a) Rachelle mentioned the available phone numbers to call in case of such an emergency and asked students to not only have the numbers on their phones but also write them somewhere safe.
 - b) Gabby asked if lawyers or legal representatives would be provided to students in such situations.
 - c) Sabine and Rachelle mention that there is a group of people in the OIS ready to roll out when students need them.
 - d) Gabby mentioned the late response of OIS to student queries.
 Usually up to 2 weeks
 - (1) Sabine and Rachelle mentioned that it should not be happening because the head of OIS believes they are seamless, and if it's still happening, the GRO should let them know.
- IV. Review of Ron Daniels and Provost Teams Meeting (Monday, March 10, 6-7:30, Shriver Hall Board Room).
 - o Presentation on the outcomes of the meeting by Arman
 - 1. Two meetings per year with the president instead of one.
 - 2. Career advising and mentorship
 - a) Gabby explained that it is a complex process and not much has changed, but Sabine is working on some things related to the situation. However, the process looks pretty slow.
 - b) Caroline and Arman emphasized that their reluctance is mandatory. Faculty training on mentorship

- 3. Communication issues are resolved by clarity and the attention of whoever is concerned. After the meeting, we also observed a good change in the advisor structure.
- 4. International Student status and protection already discussed tonight

 in selecting representatives on student advisory committees, and there was late or
 almost no feedback on the PDF share claiming they have comments on a Google
 doc. GRO was blamed for not following up with the two advisors simultaneously.
- o Still no word from them on the statement review
- Gabby mentioned the statement is already been sent to other school student groups for approval.
- Arman mentioned that the GRO bylaws do not stipulate that the advisor or admin review statements apart from the board and GC.
