The Office of Pre-Professional Programs and Advising is excited for you to participate in the Virtual Mock Interview Program! We are thankful for our Blue Jay alumni who have volunteered to be your mock interviewers!

With a wealth of experience and knowledge, Johns Hopkins alumni are well-equipped to assist you with prepping for your exciting interview day.

Mock interviews are designed to be general practice interviews and are not targeted to a specific medical school or program. Information on medical school interview content, including <u>Guide Five</u> and sample questions can be found on the <u>EY26 Committee Process</u> website under the Interviewing tab. Additional resources are also available on the <u>Office of Pre-professional Programs and Advising website</u>.

- Mock interviews can be conducted via Skype, Zoom, or similar platform and are expected to last approximately 60 minutes (30-40 minutes of interviewing; 20-30 minutes feedback/discussion).
- Applicants are allowed one virtual mock interview during the application cycle.
- Only applicants who have received an interview invite can schedule a mock interview.
- Mock interviews are an opportunity to practice but should be treated as seriously as the
 actual interview. Applicants are expected to be on time, prepared and dress professionally
 for the interview.

If you have an upcoming interview and would like to participate in the Virtual Mock Interview Program, complete the Mock Interview Program sign up, and a member of the Pre-Professional Advising staff will contact you within five business days of your request. At the time you are matched, you will receive additional resources that will help you prepare for your virtual mock interview.
