Re: Religious Holy Days

As the 2024-2025 academic year draws near, I would like to bring to your attention some of the major religious holidays and holy days that will impact many of our students, faculty, and staff. <u>Please note</u> that this is not an all-encompassing list for every religious tradition. A longer list is available on our web site at https://studentaffairs.jhu.edu/religious-spiritual-life. The holidays listed below are those that will not only affect many of our students at some point in the academic year, but could present a clear conflict with academic demands.

In general, food or work restrictions, as well as special worship obligations may impact the ability of our students, faculty and staff to participate in university events that take place on their respective religious holy day. Please keep in mind that some observances require additional time for preparation or travel before and after the actual holy day. I am asking that you please be responsive to requests from students who need to make advance arrangements with you to make up work missed because of a holy observance. CHRISTIAN

Christmas (Orthodox) January 7, 2025 Ash Wednesday March 5, 2025 Good Friday April 18, 2025 Easter (Western & Orthodox) April 20, 2025

HINDU

Diwali October 30 – Nov 3, 2024 (New Moon Day is celebrated 11/1)

Holi March 14, 2025

<u>JEWISH</u> (*Jewish holy days and religious festivals begin at sunset the evening of the first date*).

Rosh Hashanah October 2 – October 4, 2024 Yom Kippur October 11 – October 12, 2024 Sukkot October 16 – October 23, 2024

Sh'mini Atzeret October 23 - 24, 2024Simchat Torah October 24 - 25, 2024

Hanukkah December 25, 2024 – January 2, 2025

Pesach (Passover) April 12 - 20, 2025 Shavuot June 1 - 3, 2025

<u>MUSLIM</u> (Muslim holy days are based on a lunar calendar, and the actual dates are determined by direct observation of the moon and announced by the local mosque. The dates listed below may vary by a day or two).

Ramadan February 28 – March 29, 2025

Eid-al-Fitr March 30, 2025 Eid-al-Adha June 6 - 7, 2025
